INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS SELECTION AND EVALUATION

The legal responsibility for instructional materials used in the Dodgeland School District rests ultimately with the Board. The selection of instructional materials is delegated to the appropriate professionally trained certified personnel who shall complete this responsibility in accordance with established district selection criteria and procedures

The district provides instructional materials, including library media materials, to accomplish the goals and objectives of the school system. Instructional materials are provided that meet specific curriculum goals. The library media center provides materials for various levels of learning with a wide range of appeal and different points of view to support the curriculum, encourage independent study and research, foster literacy and learning skills, and promote personal reading enjoyment.

The District shall not discriminate in the selection and evaluation of instructional and library/media materials on the basis of sex, race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established complaint procedures.
