EMPLOYEE EXPOSURE TO BLOODBORNE PATHOGENS

The Dodgeland School District has developed an exposure control plan to promote a safe and healthful work environment. As required by law, the plan is designed to reduce an employee's exposure to bloodborne pathogens in the workplace including, but not limited to, the hepatitis B virus (HBV) and human immunodeficiency virus (HIV).

It is the district's intention that, if necessary, the physical facility, work practices and other areas will be modified to attain the plan's goals. In addition, employees shall be informed and trained so that they can contribute to the reduction and prevention of exposure.

To ensure that the exposure control plan is kept up to date, it shall be reviewed every three years and amended as needed, and whenever practices are implemented that may affect occupational exposure. Recommended changes will be reviewed and acted upon by the Board.
